Important Reminders:

Exercise your rights! Remember to request your absentee ballot if you wish to vote by mail in the upcoming June 2 primary. We are being urged to vote by mail, to protect the health of poll workers as well as our own and other voters' health. Click <u>here</u> for detailed instructions or call 202-741-5283. Request forms for mail-in ballots must be <u>RECEIVED</u> by May 26. Feel free to call the ERCV office if you need help to request a ballot online, which does not require a signature. Those who receive the SPCA Newsletter will get a paper application for an absentee

ballot. Your Absentee Ballot must be **SIGNED AND POSTMARKED at least by election day** (June 2) and received by June 9. You should receive a Voter Guide in the mail, but you can also access it <u>here</u>. It contains the early voting locations, election-day voting locations, voting dates and times, and lists of candidates. Those who have requested or mailed in absentee ballots can track them at <u>Track Your Mail-In Ballot</u>.

Census 2020: Be sure you are counted! If you haven't yet completed the census for your household, there are three ways to do so. You will be asked to enter your 12-digit Census ID available from the mailed invitation; but you can use your address instead.

- 1. <u>Online</u>: Go to <u>www.My2020census.gov</u> to complete the questionnaire or to have your questions answered.
- 2. <u>Phone</u>: Call 844-330-2020 any day from 7am to 2am EST (we reached a representative and verified these hours). If you press 0 at any point during the automated messages, you will be connected to a live person who can take your information.
- 3. <u>By mail</u>: Paper census questionnaires were to be delivered by mid-April to households which have not completed the Census. Mail your completed form back to the Census Bureau in the included prepaid envelope.
