The most recent issue of the *Consumer Checkbook* included <u>an extensive article on aging in place</u>, including mention of ERCV in the section on senior villages. The full article is well worth reading – it is a rich source of information on various aspects of

Eighty <u>subsidized senior apartments are coming this year to The Parks at Walter Reed</u>. Sixty-four of the 1-bedroom apartments will be rented for \$1170 per month (about 50% of market rate) to seniors with annual household income of \$25,000 to \$47,000. Fourteen apartments are reserved for those with annual incomes under \$25,000. The waiting list for these units will be opening this spring, with occupancy planned for late summer 2019. ERCV PORTRAITS - Meet Anna & Joe Hairston



(Editor's Note: ERCV members and friends are interesting people! We hope you will meet each other at ERCV events. Meanwhile, we are planning a series of "portraits" in future newsletters.)

Meet your Village neighbors Anna and Joseph Hairston, 96 years old, full of history, wisdom, and humor; parents of four daughters; a military family stationed around the world for 20 years, then Shepherd Park homeowners since 1963 and Joe's second career as an IRS lawyer; volunteers with decades of service; generous neighbors; and so much more.

Joe served in two wars—WW II and Korea—as an enlisted man and as an officer; before and after integration; both internationally (Italy, Korea, Okinawa/Japan) and stateside (eight states including Louisiana, where Anna grew up on a 200-acre farm).

From his enlistment at age 18 through the harsh years of transition in the military from segregation to non-discrimination that began with President Truman's 1948 order, "I suffered," says Joe. "But that experience was my motivation to participate in eradicating segregation." Anna describes travelling to new postings in segregated America, unable to take her girls into restaurants and other public spaces. The stories are chilling, yet told without apparent bitterness.

Positive memories are plentiful. Anna, a lifelong learner, glows when recounting the travel and new experiences those Army years provided her and her girls. "I ask questions. I am nosey. I want to know, to learn, to absorb." As she moved her family to new places, this passion for learning led her to open her "American style" home in Okinawa to Nara University students; to conversing with and embracing Helen Keller; and to enrolling in courses such as Japanese flower arranging (ikebana).

While completing his military service Joe had attended night school to earn a U. Maryland B.A. and a J.D. (law, from Washington College of Law) and a Masters degree in the law of taxation (LL.M. Georgetown). After admission to the DC Bar, Joe joined the Internal Revenue Service as an attorney.

Settled in DC, Anna served as a volunteer docent at the Smithsonian Museum of Natural History for 17 years, sharing her knowledge of the natural world. "I love that museum!" says Anna. She also volunteered at the front desk of the old Walter Reed Army Medical Center for 27 years.

In their 55 years in Shepherd Park, Joe and Anna have been active shapers of this diverse, stable Ward 4 community, from their church (Takoma Park Baptist) to citizens' advisory boards (post office, WGL), and especially, leading founders of Neighbors, Inc., committed to creating stable, integrated communities. Back in the 1960s they exposed discriminatory real estate practices by pairing with a white couple to gather evidence leading to legislative reform. They remember happily the interracial open houses where neighbors got to know each other.

Anna reports that she reads three newspapers every day, has never felt out of place, and is never bored. Joe is known as a DIY guy, with a tool or a work-around solution for every problem. His age doesn't keep him from being the first one out with a snow blower, clearing his neighbors' walkways as well as his own! Truly, lives well lived! —Gay Gellhorn
